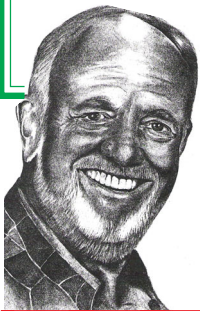

PHASE I TO OPEN APRIL '09

At this time the plan is to complete Phase I by March 2009, move into the new building in April 2009 and begin the second term in the new school. Frank Pupe, building supervisor, is very optimistic that this plan will work and ensures us that his crew will work hard to make sure the building phase is completed on time. Currently, the foundation is complete along with the septic tanks and cement flooring (for phase one). The completion of this portion of the project ensures us that the walls will be up by the end of the rainy season, which will be sometime after the first of the year.

A meeting has been set by the Zambian committee with the current landlord in order to negotiate a three month lease rather than another one year lease. This short-term lease will allow the school to meet in its current location while providing a specific target for moving into the new building.

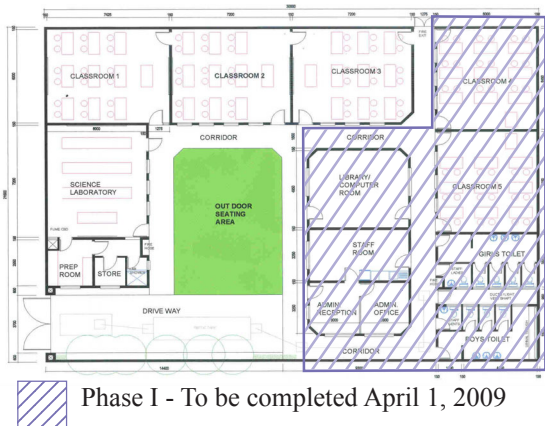

I opened with a word of prayer after the graduating students walked in dancing. Mr. Mwale welcomed our guest of honor, who is a counselor for Kalingalinga, School Board, parents and past Chifundo students. He then gave a brief history of Chifundo School now J.O. Chifundo School. He explained about how hard things have been in the past and how bright the future of the school is getting.

After Mr. Mwale we had a motivation speech from one of the Teachers, who asked the students to be always faithful, hopeful and disciplined as they go out to serve. The students were also challenged to continue working hard by our Civic leader who also thanked the management of the J.O. Chifundo School for bringing development in Kalingalinga through education. The Representatives of the School Board ended the speech time with a vote of thanks by Mr. Geoffrey Sizala who urged the students to be creative so they can be able to raise funds to go to college as it is a challenge for most of the parents to provide them funds for college. He also asked for parents support for their children through college. He wished we had scholarships or loans to help them start something that will help them raise money for college. We are moving from having only two bath rooms for the whole school to have ten bathrooms on our new building. I also informed them that next term will have all the books and asked the parents to be open and contribute in any way possible.

We also saw the presentations of awards and certificates of completion to all the students and awarded to the best students in different subjects. The over all winner was a girl named Melody Simpindu. Mr. Mwale also received an award as the most hard working teacher. We closed our ceremony with dancing and then photo taking.

This was a great start to our permanent building. I know the news of the graduation will bring more students to J.O. Chifundo School. Thank you to all of you for your great works that have seen hundreds of boys and girls graduate from High School.

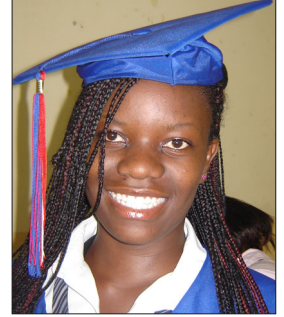
